



Test of shipments from Japan for radioactivity

Precautionary checks of shipments

Lufthansa Cargo decided, as a precautionary measure, to check cargo shipments shipped from Japan for radioactivity. At Tokyo-Narita, Osaka and Nagoya, the three stations in Japan currently being served by Lufthansa and Lufthansa Cargo, all freight is checked for possible radioactive contamination before it is loaded onto the aircraft. According to the information available at present, it is extremely unlikely that cargo shipments will reveal heightened levels of radioactivity. In order to rule out any potential risk of contamination, however, these tests will be continued until further notice.

Calibrated Geiger counters are used to perform the checks. Cargo is only transported if it complies with normal ambient radioactivity (as defined in the German Radiation Protection Ordinance).
